The Santa Cruz Police Department is now reporting UCR CIBRS/NIBRS per DOJ/FBI recommendations. CIBRS/NIBRS is a point in time report, which is continuously updated until the final numbers are reported to DOJ/FBI early the following year. Some reminders when reviewing the data:

- →The hierarchy rule no longer applies*, and up to 10 offenses are reported per case this means we are potentially reporting higher counts in each offense category. For example, previously if SCPD took a case with an assault on an officer, shoplifting, and drug possession, SCPD would have reported 1 aggravated assault. Now, in UCR NIBRS/CIBRS SCPD would report 1 aggravated assault, 1 larceny/theft offense, and 1 drug possession for that same case.
- →These numbers update as crimes are reported or once case dispositions change (point in time data)
- →Our offense numbers will not be final until DOJ/FBI accepts our 2024 annual submission all data contained herein represents a preliminary report
