- The number of firefighters, paramedics and lifeguards on duty
- How much more the city will do to help create new businesses and jobs
- Whether or not the potholes on your street will be filled this year

The City Council and staff are offering a basic, easy-to-understand workshop on the City budget. Vice Mayor Don Lane, City Manager Martín Bernal and City Finance Director Jack Dilles will all be on hand to provide information and answer questions.
