INFORMATION:

On October 5, 2011 at 2:25 pm, Santa Cruz Police Department officers Carter Jones and Al Nottingham were flagged down outside of their patrol car on the corner of Seabright and Murray. Two male victims stated that a group of five males in a blue Toyota Camry had brandished a handgun at them in the area of Beach Street and Riverside Avenue a few minutes earlier. As the information was being relayed to the officers the vehicle drove past their location heading in the area of the yacht harbor.

Officers Jones and Nottingham located the vehicle a short time later, abandoned but still running, in the 200 block of Fourth Avenue. Witnesses stated the occupants of the vehicle had fled toward the harbor. Incoming units quickly located the five suspects next to the harbor and detained them at gunpoint. Witnesses identified the five that were detained as having fled from the Camry. Officers determined the vehicle had been stolen earlier in the day from Santa Clara. All five subjects are believed to be members of a criminal street gang in San Jose. At this point the firearm used in the brandishing has not been located.

Santa Cruz Harbor Patrol, Santa Cruz County Sheriff's deputies and the Santa Cruz Police Department K9 aided in the search for the suspects and weapon. Mr. Lindsay and Mr. Reynoso were booked into Santa Cruz County Jail, the other three juveniles were booked into Juvenile Hall. No one was hurt during the incident.
