<u>INFORMATION</u>: UPDATE: On December 20, 2011 reports began to filter in to the Santa Cruz Police Department about catalytic converter thefts that occurred late on December 19th or early on December 20th. Four catalytic converters were taken, all from Toyota 4Runners, in the western portion of Santa Cruz. The thefts occurred on Monterey Avenue, Centennial, Continental and Nevada. The Santa Cruz Police Department partnered with Toyota of Santa Cruz to help secure the catalytic converters. Through the end of the year Toyota will perform the service free with a donation to Second Harvest Food Bank or Toys for Tots.

ORIGINAL – November 26/27, 2011: On November 27, 2011 Santa Cruz Police Department officers began to receive reports of multiple catalytic converter thefts that occurred in the eastern portion of the city. In all, eight cases were reported (locations listed below). All of the victims owned either a Toyota 4Runner or Toyota Tacoma truck. The victims believed the thefts occurred sometime between 11:00 pm on Saturday night and 6:00 am on Sunday morning. One witness stated seeing two unknown males running from one of the trucks. At this point there is no additional suspect information. The thefts are preliminary believed to have caused over \$10,000 in total damages and expenses to the vehicle owners. The suspects are wanted on multiple felony counts of grand theft.
