1. Pacific Collegiate School Relocation

3004 Mission Street CP14-0032

APN 002-691-02

Design Permit for the conversion of an office building to a school (Pacific Collegiate) including remodel of the existing building, the addition of a portable building and parking lot and landscape improvements. Planned Development Permit for variations to allow a school in an industrial zone, setbacks and bicycle parking requirements. Watercourse Development Permit to allow walkway and deck to encroach into the development setback. (Environmental Determination: Mitigated Negative Declaration) (Dascom Enterprises, Inc., owner/filed: 2/25/2014)

RECOMMENDATION: That the Planning Commission consider this item and make a recommendation to the City Council to adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration and either: 1) Deny the application, or 2) Approve the application consisting of a Planned Development, Design Permit and Watercourse Development Permit to allow the relocation of a charter school to the I-G/PER2 zone district, based on the attached Draft Resolutions and the Conditions of Approval listed in Exhibit A.

ACTION:

The Planning Commission <u>RECOMMENDED</u> that the City Council adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration, and approve the Planned Development, Design Permit and Watercourse Development Permit with the following changes to the Conditions of Approval:

- Delete number 27;
- ➤ Change number 34 to read: The applicant will provide a minimum of 60 bicycle parking spaces.
