Adjacent to 665 Chestnut Street CP16-0069 APN: NA Administrative Use Permit, Special Use Permit and Design Permit for a telecommunication facility in the public right-of-way adjacent to 665 Chestnut Street. Appeals must be received by the City Clerk within ten (10) calendar days following the date of the action from which such appeal is being taken. An appeal must be accompanied by a five hundred fourteen dollar (\$514) filing fee, unless the item involves a Coastal Permit that is appealable to the Coastal Commission, in which case there is no fee.
