Items Removed from the Consent Agenda

5. City of Santa Cruz/Soquel Creek Water District (SqCWD) Desalination Task Force – Draft Operational Plan & Agreement materials January, February & March 2009

The commission expressed concern about the Capital Cost share ratio that is based upon a priority of use system in which the City pays 59% City and 41% for SqCWD. The cost share ratio seems inequitable since the SqCWD's need for desalinated water is greater than the City's in most years and it would be nearly impossible for SqCWD to go out and build its own plant.

Commissioner L. Kasa moved to request that Commissioner A. Schiffrin (Water Commission representative to the Desalination Task Force) schedule a meeting with Desalination Task Force Member (Councilmember M. Rotkin) in order to present the Water Commission concerns regarding the Capital Cost Share allocation of 59% City and 41% Soquel Creek Water District and report back at the next meeting. Commissioner C. Keutmann seconded.

General Business

1. Water Shortage Ordinance and Declaration of Water Shortage for 2009

Water Conservation Manager Goddard provided the staff report on this item and answered questions from the public and the commission.

Public Comments

John Bergwall provided comments requesting that consideration be given to pressure washing for construction projects such as sealing concrete and that flexibility be given to watering or misting container plants every other day.

General Commission Comments

Concern was expressed about how this year's shortage is being publicized. The Integrated Water Plan includes use a planned curtailment of 15% in a worst case scenario such as the 1976-77 drought and was deemed an acceptable shortage amount.

It was discussed whether separate actions should be taken to 1) declare the Stage 2 Water Shortage and the corresponding action related to the declaration; and 2) to adopt the Water Shortage Ordinance as a separate action that would be included in the Municipal Code.

Specific Comments on the Draft Water Shortage Ordinance

Page 56 - Include a brief definition of dry and critically dry in the second whereas.

Page 58- Section 1, identify the conditions that constitute a water shortage

Page 60 - Letter C. Change 24 hours to one working day.

Page 63 – Number 3 include sealing of concrete; and Number 7. add at the end of last sentence with a shut off nozzle; and Number 8. Include a provision to define hand watering and a discussion of old style sprinklers attached to hoses.

Page 65 - Number 7 change the _____'s to specific

Page 68 – Number 7 change the _____'s to specific

Page 74 – Include information on how the appeal board is appointed and a nominal appeal fee.

Page 76- Letter C. Add the fee for disconnect

Commissioner A. Schiffrin moved to recommend Council adoption of the Water Shortage Ordinance as amended by the Commission comments noted and return it in November for further review. Commissioner B. Fouse seconded

The Technical Advisor has started preliminary work on the request for proposals (RFP) for the full-scale environmental impact report (EIR).
