## **INFORMATION:**


On March 11<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 2206 hours, the Santa Cruz Police Department responded to a call of shots heard in the 100 block of Myrtle St. Upon arrival, officers confirmed a firearm was in fact discharged in the area and luckily no one was discovered to have been struck as a result. As responding officers canvassed the area for witnesses, video surveillance was collected which captured the shooting. Officers were able to obtain a description of the suspect vehicle, which matched the license plate provided to dispatchers. Officers quickly located the vehicle in the area and subsequently conducted a vehicle stop in the 2200 block of Mission St. Three occupants of the vehicle were detained and transported to the Santa Cruz Police Department for questioning. The occupants of the vehicle were identified as Frank Kuit, 24 years old, Hunter Everly, 25 years old, and a third occupant who was later released. During a search of the vehicle, officers located two loaded firearms, an illegal high-capacity magazine, and crack cocaine.

Kuit was arrested for willful discharge of a firearm in a negligent manner, possession of a loaded firearm, possession of an unregistered firearm, and possession of an illegal high-capacity magazine. Everly was arrested for possession and transportation of a controlled substance, possession of controlled substance while armed with a firearm, commission of a felony while out on bail, and an outstanding warrant.
