Proposal

For 1.5 hours leading up to sunset-time in an open outdoor area, 200 participants have the opportunity to make giant soap bubbles with one of the 200 3-foot tri-cord dowel and string rigs in my collection paired with homemade soap bubble mix.

In their physical delicacy, bubbles exemplify timeless metaphoric meaning for the ephemerality and beauty of life. Also, bubbles are plain good, fun. In their simplicity is an invitation to regress to a child-like state of unknowing.

All bubble juice will be made on-site on the day of the program. Assistance will be provided by friends and fellow artists to assemble wands, make bubble juice, and set up and take down the event.

Santa Cruz City Arts can provide promotion. Artist can promote on Facebook and word of mouth.

15 hours of preparation and breakdown, bubble knowledge, 200 5-quart buckets, 200+ tri-cord wands, 24+ 5-gallon buckets






