- □ Know several different escape routes from your neighborhood. Visit the City Evacuation Planning Page. Find and download your neighborhood evacuation zone to get familiar with all the ways out.

- $\hfill\square$ Have an evacuation plan for pets and animals
- ☐ Create a Communication Plan that designates an out-of-area friend or relative as a point of contact to act as a single source of communication among family members in case of separation.
- ☐ Sign up to receive alerts at cruzaware.genasys.com/portal/en

- ☐ Have fire extinguishers on hand and train your family how to use them (check expiration dates regularly).
- ☐ Maintain at least half a tank of fuel in your vehicles at all times.
- ☐ Assemble GO-Bags (emergency supply kits)
 - For your home
 - For your car
 - For every member of your household
- Maintain a list of emergency contacts posted in your GO-Bag(s). Keep City and County street maps in your car. Download maps to phones
- ☐ Know how to turn off utilities to your home. If you hear, smell, or see evidence of gas, turn it off.

How to Prepare for Evacuation

Prepare for Evacuation	Outside the House
☐ Alert family members and neighbors.	☐ MOVE flammable items from the outside
☐ Dress in appropriate clothing	bring them inside or move > 100' from the house
☐ Have personal protective equipment	☐ Turn OFF propane tanks.
(gloves, goggles, mask, sturdy shoes)	If you hear, see, or smell evidence of gas, shut it off.
 □ Grab your Go Bag & add last-minute items. □ Tune in to a Local Radio Station: KBCZ 90.1FM, KSCO 1080AM, KZSC 88.1FM or KPIG 107 □ Drink plenty of water. Prepare your family & 	☐ Move propane BBQs away from structures. Leave exterior lights on ets! ☐ Put your GO-Bag in your vehicle.
Inside the House	□ BACK car into driveway -doors/windows closed.□ Carry car keys with you at all times

Remember the Six "P"s	Basic Emergency Supply Kit
☐ 1. P eople & pets.	☐ 1.First Aid Kit.
☐ 2. P hone numb <mark>ers & important documents.</mark>	☐ 2.Battery or hand crank radio & a NOAA weather radio.
☐ 3. P rescriptions, vitamins, & eyeglasses.	☐ 3.Battery or hand crank flashlight w/ extra batteries.
☐ 4. P ictures & irreplaceable memorabilia.	☐ 4. Whistle, local topographical map, & a plan.
☐ 5. P ersonal computer & external drives.	5. Wrench or pliers for shutting off utilities.
6. P lastic (cash, credit, debit, and ATM cards	☐ 6.Cell phone & Computer charger
	☐ 7.Dusk mask, plastic sheeting, & duct tape (shelter-in-place)
	☐ 8.Can opener w/ non-perishable food supply of three days.
	☐ 9. Waste bags, moist towelettes, & plastic ties
	☐ 10. Water: >1 gallon per person per day


Evacuation Time!

Do not wait for an evacuation order!

Make Sure you are registered to receive alerts AND know multiple ways to safety (see page 1)

- If you feel threatened by an emergency, leave immediately!
- When an evacuation order is issued by public safety officials, GO!
- When an evacuation warning is issued, prepare to evacuate.
- If you require additional time to evacuate, treat a warning as an order and start evacuating.

Use your cell phone to advise officials. Know your location! Call 911.

- · Find shelter if possible
- Stay in an area clear of vegetation
- In a group, try to stay together
- Avoid power lines, bridges and overpasses
- Avoid walking through water
- Never drive through water
- Move to higher ground in flooding situations
- In an earthquake, remain in a vehicle until shaking stops
- Expect aftershocks
