INTRODUCTION:

On January 26, 2018, Deputy Chief Martinez received a memo from Sergeant Mark Eveleth regarding a report of an alleged incident . The memo stated that on January 25, 2018, Sergeant Eveleth approached regarding an incident he had heard about at a private party. During this

Chief Mills reviewed the complaint and directed me to conduct a professional standards investigation. I was instructed to work with HR Director Lisa Murphy and to investigate the allegations together.

SUMMARY OF ALLEGATIONS:

On November 18, 2017, had a party at his residence. During the party, alleged that Officer Gunter inappropriately touched sexually. The allegation consisted of him inappropriately touching buttocks.

After reviewing Sergeant Eveleth's memo, I determined that the underlying allegations qualified as conduct unbecoming of a Santa Cruz Police Department employee. The allegations are encompassed in part by the following policies; a full version of the policies are attached

SANTA CRUZ POLICE DEPARTMENT POLICY 339 – STANDARDS OF CONDUCT & DISCIPLINE

339.1 POLICY

It is the policy of this Department that its members are highly visible representatives of government and are entrusted with the responsibility of ensuring the safety and well-being of the community as well as the delivery of police services. Since the functions of a police department have a major impact upon the community, standards of conduct for police personnel are higher than standards applied to the general public. In this regard, department members will conduct themselves in a manner which does not bring discredit upon individuals, the Department, the City, the community or the profession. A procedure is established for violation of Law and Departmental Policy. (Reference: Code of Professional Conduct and Responsibility for Peace Officers, see attachment A.)

339.2.3 CONDUCT UNBECOMING

A members conduct either on or off-duty, which could adversely reflect upon the department, will be deemed to be conduct unbecoming. Each case of misconduct will be examined to determine if the act was such that a reasonable person would find that such conduct was unbecoming a police employee. Actual conduct does not have to be public knowledge, but if known, could have an adverse effect.

339.6.4 CANON FOUR

<u>Peace Officers will so conduct their public life that they exemplify the high standards of integrity, trust and morality demanded of a member of the peace officers profession.</u>

Standard 4.4 <u>Peace Officers shall maintain a level of conduct in their personal and business</u> affairs in keeping with the high standards of the peace officers profession.

Standard 4.9 <u>Peace Officers shall at all times conduct themselves in a manner which does</u> not discredit the peace officer profession or their employing agency.

WITNESS:

On February 22, 2018, I conducted an interview with in association with Internal Affairs investigation 2018-001. The interview was conducted in person at the Santa Cruz Police Department. I interviewed him as a witness in this investigation.

on November 18, 2017. He couldn't remember how he got invited and thought it might have been through social media. the residence is located in the County of Santa Cruz The party was a BBQ style party that took place both inside the residence and in the backyard.

said there was all types of alcohol being serviced, which consisted of hard alcohol, beer, and wine. He believes someone was making mixed drinks and there were also coolers with beer.

said he drank 2 margaritas and a couple of beers during the party. He could feel the effects of alcohol, however he remembers everything that evening. He doesn't think had anything to drink at the party.

said Officer Gunter was also at the party and they had some friendly interactions with each other.

said Officer Gunter was intoxicated and in a "good mood". He was able to have conversations with Officer Gunter and he appeared to be alert and receptive during these conversations.

At one point during the party, was standing next to talking with Officer Gunter. Officer Gunter was standing directly across from with a drink in one hand. All of a sudden during the conversation, Officer Gunter reached and grabbed buttocks right in front of everyone.

is located in the County of Santa Cruz, around 1500-1600 hours. The party was a BBQ style party

that took place both inside the residence and in the backyard.

there was all types of alcohol being served, which consisted of hard alcohol, beer, and wine. may have had one drink of alcohol, but clearly remembered everything that happened at the party.

Officer Gunter also attended the party, had never met before. Officer Gunter was acting casual and that couldn't tell he was drinking alcohol. was able to have a normal conversation with him and he was not falling down drunk or even slurring his words as he spoke.

Shortly after arrived at the party, were standing with a group of people talking.

Officer Gunter was standing directly

across from . They were all having a casual conversation.

Officer Gunter then reached around with his left hand and grabbed buttocks. described it as a full grab and squeeze of buttocks.

said he hosted a party at his residence on November 18, 2017. His residence is located in the County of Santa Cruz. The party started in the afternoon and took place both inside the house and in the backyard.

invited people to his party through Facebook. About half of the guests that attended the party were co-workers and the other half were personal friends.

He remembered Officer Gunter was there and

said there were all types of alcohol being served, which consisted of hard alcohol, beer, and wine.

I asked about Officer Gunter's demeanor at the party.

Officer Gunter wasn't overly intoxicated. I asked about 's demeanor at the party.

said not intoxicated at the party.

I asked if he had seen or heard anything about Officer Gunter doing anything inappropriate at the party and he said, no. I explained the allegation in question. appeared surprised and said he has not heard anything about that.

On February 28, 2018, I conducted an interview with Officer David Gunter in association with Internal Affairs investigation 2018-001. The interview was conducted in person at the HR administrative conference room, located at 809 Center Street. Present at this interview was

Officer Gunter was interviewed as a subject	officer in this investigation.
I began the interview by explaining to Office	er Gunter the allegation made against him

Officer Gunter said he is currently living in	Prunedale and drove alone to the party. He showed
	was the second guest to arrive. He wore a Hawaiian
shirt and jeans.	
I asked Officer Gunter who he remembered	being at the party. He said there were several civilians
there who were friends with	and several PD officers and spouses.
there who were mends with	and several is officers and spouses.

I asked Officer Gunter what types of alcohol were available to drink at the party. He stated there was a beer keg and hard alcohol served that evening. For a while there were bar tenders making drinks, or you could get your own drinks. He said nobody was monitoring the alcohol consumption and that anyone could drink as much as they wanted. Officer Gunter said he first had a beer to drink, then started having mixed drinks. At one point, wanted everyone to take tequila shots, so he had a couple of those. He then had several more mixed drinks. He could feel the effects of alcohol during the party, which consisted of feeling light headed and his body was swaying back and forth. He said he wasn't "falling down drunk", but felt "good and numb".

Officer Gunter said he remembered talking to everyone and being able to hold conversations with people. Near the end of the night, he began drinking water in order to sober up. He was able to sober up enough to drive home after the party.

I asked Officer Gunter if he had any contact with at the party. Officer Gunter said he remembered meeting , but he doesn't remember having a conversation with at some point during the party.

I asked Officer Gunter if he remembered doing anything sexually inappropriate that evening. Officer Gunter said there was a lot of "horse play" going on at the party. I asked him to explain what kinds of "horse play". He said guys would try and hit each other in the testicles and groin area. Throughout the party, all the guys were trying to get each other back. I asked Officer Gunter if he partook in the "horse play". He said he remembered hitting in the thigh, but that is all he remembered.

I explained to Officer Gunter the allegation brought forward against him. I told him that the allegation was that he grabbed and squeezed buttocks while they were having a conversation. Officer Gunter said he doesn't remember grabbing buttocks, but feels horrible about it. He said it's possible that it happened, however he doesn't recall that happening. I asked him what he thought about the allegation and he stated, "It's horrific".

Officer Gunter said he felt like crap about it and said that it was "totally unacceptable" on his part.

I asked Officer Gunter why he doesn't remember the incident. Officer Gunter said he was drinking heavily and doesn't remember most of the party. He said he was in shock and never thought he would do something like that to someone.

Officer Gunter had no further information.

CONCLUSION & FINDINGS:

This investigation focused on allegations of sexual misconduct by Officer Gunter
. During the course of my investigations, many issues and concerns were raised regarding how Officer Gunter conducts himself off-duty in regards to his alcohol consumption and sexual misconduct.

Concerns were raised regarding his unlawful and illegal sexual touching of someone else's body

It is my assessment that Officer Gunter lacks credibility for the following reasons.

During the interview of Officer Gunter, he was unable to recall committing any of these allegations and blamed his behavior and lack of memory on being heavily intoxicated.

Although I do in fact believe Officer Gunter was intoxicated at both parties, his excuse of "I was too drunk to remember", was proven to be implausible. Officer Gunter could provide specific details , however he conveniently doesn't remember sexually battering .

Here are a few examples of Officer Gunter's selective memory throughout each party:

- Officer Gunter could remember in detail what he wore , when he arrived, and when he left.
- He could remember "horse playing" at party. This consisted of hitting each other's testicles and groin area. He remembered partaking in these games, however doesn't remember assaulting .

The following is a summary of my findings:

<u>Incident Conclusion & Findings Regarding the</u> <u>Party Allegation:</u>

1) Officer Gunter grabbed 's buttocks.

On November 18, 2017, hosted a party at his residence.

There was an unlimited amount of alcohol available to drink, which consisted of beer, wine, and mixed hard alcohol drinks.

During the party, Officer David Gunter had several alcoholic beverages and became intoxicated. At one point during the party, Officer Gunter began having a conversation with during the conversation, Officer Gunter reached around and grabbed and squeezed buttocks.

witnessed the entire incident.

During the interview of Officer Gunter, he was unable to recall committing the battery and blamed his behavior and lack of memory on being heavily intoxicated.

Officer Gunter could not provide any satisfactory evidence that could dispute and/or contradict and the evidence gained during this investigation. Officer Gunter failed to deny committing the battery, and finally there is a credible witness .

Officer Gunter's conduct that evening adversely reflected upon the Santa Cruz Police Department and his conduct was unbecoming. His low standards of conduct has brought discredit to the peace officer profession.

Therefore, based on

statements, Officer Gunters lack of denial and the corresponding

independent statements, I make the following findings:

Findings:

- Allegation that Officer Gunter violated SCPD Policy 339.2.3:

339.2.3 CONDUCT UNBECOMING

A members conduct either on or off-duty, which could adversely reflect upon the department, will be deemed to be conduct unbecoming.

Finding: SUSTAINED

- Allegation that Officer Gunter violated SCPD Policy 339.6.4:

339.6 CANONS OF ETHICS

339.6.4 CANON FOUR

Standard 4.4 <u>Peace Officers shall maintain a level of conduct in their personal and business affairs in keeping with the high standards of the peace officers profession.</u>

It should be noted, Officer Gunter's sexual misconduct rose to a criminal sexual battery, 243.4 PC. At the time of this investigations, criminal charges against Officer Gunter at this time.	level of misdemeanor declined to press any
