1:30 – 1:50 pm Introductions + Good News in Climate

- Mayor welcome group participants in person and virtual
 - O Mayor: emphasized the role and importance of government(s) (City of Santa Cruz) in addressing the challenges brought on by climate change.
 - The CATF should function as an advisory body for putting the CAP into action (operationalizing).
- Introductions / Good News in Climate
 - Mayor/Tiffany invites all in person participants to introduce themselves, the organization they are affiliated with (if any) and share any good news in climate (in 1 minute or less each).
 - Good news in climate is tradition with this group to share and celebrate climate successes, bolster hope and optimism, and improve coordination across sectors.
 - Good news in climate can be anything participants feel is worthwhile to share with the group, e.g., event announcements, grants landed, project milestones, etc.


1:50 – 2:05 pm Review Purpose of CATF + Meeting Schedule

- Share slide deck on Teams/in room
 - o Purpose: Help City Implement 2 Climate Plans, for example:
 - Feedback on initial planning of initiatives
 - Feedback on deliverables of initiatives
 - Working sessions on particular facets of initiatives
 - Guest speakers on relevant topics/projects
 - These 2 Plans have assessed, prioritized and sequenced projects, policies and programs to meet City targets and goals.
 - O City Council adopts workplans based on these plans that direct staff work
 - Climate Action Plan 2030 3 year workplan / 2023 departmental plans

- Climate Adaptation Plan update and current workplan largely related to coastal resilience, flood control and climate change.
- Health in All Policies 2023 2024 workplan (related due to sustainability pillar)
- Some CATF members expressed interest in forming subcommittees that would address different aspects of the CAP. However, city staff explained the feasibility of creating subcommittees is unlikely due to limited City resources and staff. Staff are looking for assistance with the Implementation Partners Roundtable later in the year.
- Review schedule and nail down a regular time (August, October, December 2023; February, April, 2024), e.g. Second Thursday of the month at 1:30 pm for 1 hour?
 - Do we need to make accommodations for outside of work hours for optimal in person participation?
 - O Do we need a doodle poll?
 - o Are there other accommodations needed by the group?
 - Most CATF participants stated that the scheduled time of Second Thursday
 1:30-2:30pm worked with their schedule. One participant was unsure but felt that they could attend virtually.
 - Some members proposed making CATF attendance in-person only. City staff (Berny and Tiffany) informed the group that allowing people to attend virtually is important for ensuring that the general public has access to the meetings.
