1:30 – 1:45 pm Good News in Climate

- Jonathon: Seymour Center had successful Climate Solutions Block Party with new climate exhibits
- Val: Governor signed into law <u>AB 253</u> requiring the reporting and verification of statewide greenhouse gas emissions by large businesses doing business in CA; <u>City has been reporting</u> emissions and climate risk to CDP since 2018.
- Phil: BCycle stats indicate high uptake in first months; <u>SB 410</u> requires Public Utilities Commission to set a reasonable average and maximum target energization time periods; UCSC released <u>plan to electrify campus</u>
- Sahm: Stanford <u>agreement</u> between major solar developers, conservation groups, agricultural organizations, environmental and environmental justice groups, and tribal entities to advance large-scale U.S. solar development while championing land conservation and supporting local community interests
- Jacki: DOE finds energy jobs have increased in 95% of US counties
- Grace: City is launching an Induction Cooktop Loaner Program with SC Libraries to launch at end of the month
- Pauline (online): What Can I do about Climate event at London Nelson Center had 90 people visit and 22 organizations; great tabling at Seymour Center event; providing upcoming EN ROADS training
- Jenny (online): just received solar PV permit and got in under NEM 2.0. Congrats
