SUBJECT: Update on Waste Water System Enterprise Long Range Financial

Planning

RECOMMENDATION: For Information Only

BACKGROUND: The Public Works Department operates a regional wastewater treatment plant serving over 100,000 customers, and manages over 150 miles of sewer collection pipe within the City of Santa Cruz. Delivering safe and reliable collection and treatment of wastewater requires over 50 Full Time Equivalent staff, as well as intensive capital investment in major infrastructure, equipment and facilities. Studies completed between 2018 and 2020 identified a number of major pieces of equipment at the wastewater treatment plant that have reached or will soon reach the end of their functional life and require replacement. Reinforcing the need to address aging equipment, the primary electrical feed failed in 2023 and required a number of emergency response measures which exceeded \$1,000,000 to implement and impacted normal operations. Ultimately, over the next decade investments exceeding \$170,000,000 will be needed to replace and modernize the wastewater system.

Given the scope, scale and duration of this work, Public Works staff sought assistance from the Water Department with financial planning. The Water Department's Long Range Financial Plan and associated financial model created in 2016, have been critical tools for establishing sound financial policy and management, informing rate making, supporting the planning of long range capital investment and securing low interest loans and grants to support critical projects.

Work between Water and Public Works staff initiated in Fall 2023 and consists of the following tasks to be completed over the next 18 months:

- 1) Develop a Wastewater System Long Range Financial Plan-review existing policies, credit ratings, and develop policies such as reserve levels and debt service coverage
- 2) Develop a comprehensive 10-year financial model-this model integrates operating and capital budgets, forecast future expenses, assigns inflationary factors, allows for assumptions about

financing/debt issuance to understand how current and future expenditures will interrelate with various policies adopted in the Financial Plan

3) Complete a Cost of Service Analysis which will culminate with recommended 5 year wastewater rates in July 2025

The Commission will receive an overview presentation on financial planning as well as summary of key deliverables, milestones and future planned Commission touch-points.
